

Important Notes about APOSTILLE Requirements

Since July 14, 2007, the Republic of Korea has been a part of the 1961 Hague Convention abolishing the Requirement of Legalization for Foreign Public Documents. The Convention provides for the simplified certification of public(including notarized) documents to be used in countries that have joined the convention. The APOSTILLE ensures that public documents issued in one signatory country will be recognized as valid in another signatory country.

APOSTILLE certificates should be arrived in UNIST by January 18th(Wed.), 2023(By Post) to Mr. Shin, Hyunjin of UNIST Admissions Team(Mailing Address: Admissions Team, Room #105, Main Administrative Building(201), UNIST-gil 50, Ulju-gun, Ulsan 44919, Republic of Korea). A. Newly admitted students from countries which are signatories to the convention must meet the following requirements:

1. Official certificates(Transcripts and diploma) should be submitted with the APOSTILLE attached.
2. All documents should be in English. Documents in another language should be accompanied by a notarized English translation.

* If the original certificate is issued only once, make a copy of the document and get an apostille (consular confirmation) on the copy.

1. Official certificates(Transcripts and diploma) must be legalized by [the Korean embassy or consulate](#).
 2. All documents should be in English. Documents in another language should be accompanied by a notarized English translation.
